(June 2019) was the number 1 picture book from a debut author and illustrator in 2019, On the Sunday Times Bestseller list and Won the overall Waterstones Children's book prize in 2020. It is a story about hilarious, science-mad chatterbox, Rocket who believes she's going to be the greatest astronaut, star-catcher, space-traveller that has ever lived! The follow up, Clean UP! follows Rocket on holiday to visit her grandparents, when she's shocked by the pollution that's spoiling their island home and putting the local sea life at risk. Can she think of a way to save the day? Illuminated has just optioned the book to develop into a TV series. Nathan's new book in the series is, SPEAK UP! where passionate Rocket organises a peaceful protest to save her local library!






