Rationale for Home Learning

After consideration of Department for Education (DfE) guidance on the occasion of children being asked to self-isolate for a period of time during the COVID-19 pandemic, we are making specific provision available for their home learning. Children will be asked to self-isolate and learn from home if:

- a) They are well, but having to self-isolate for 14 days with the rest of their bubble following a confirmed case of COVID-19.
- b) They are well, but having to self-isolate for 14 days following a confirmed case of COVID-19 with a family member/contact outside of school.
- c) They are well but having to isolate for a few days while awaiting a household test result.

Arrangements for Home Learning for a Bubble

The following activities will be put in place when a bubble has to self-isolate for 14 days following a confirmed case of COVID-19.

^{*}All children have a Google classroom ID and password. This information has been sent home. Parents should contact class teachers via Class Dojo if they require this to be sent again.

Teachers will provide appropriate work for the children in their classes, including adapted work for children with additional needs.

Keeping in touch with a bubble who are self-isolating

Where teachers are well and able to do so, they will keep in regular contact with the children in their class to ensure that they are accessing the learning and are well.

EYFS - Class Teachers will use the Class Dojo Class Story to contact parents and pupils.

KS1, LKS2 and UKS2 Teachers will keep in touch with children via weekly Google Meets, by talking to each child individually and checking that they can access the work. If any children do not attend the weekly Google Meet, teachers will ring them and check that they are well and are accessing the work.

The School website and Twitter accounts will be used for notices and individual Class Dojo accounts will be used for general messaging.

Arrangements for Home Learning for Individual children

Where a child is self-isolating for up to 14 days whilst their class is still in school, the following arrangements will be in place. For all year groups a grid of learning objectives and activities which mirror the learning in school will be uploaded to Class Dojo and/or Google Classroom. Where appropriate, teaching materials from lessons delivered in school will be added to Google Classroom. This will cover a range of lessons including English, maths, reading and foundation subjects.
