### DON'T FORGET...



...If you have a problem at school don't ignore it as it will get bigger and bigger. You can ask your teacher, mum/dad, teaching assistant, learning mentor, lunch time supervisor or school counsellor for help

...If one of your friends or someone in your school is upset or doesn't come to school very often, ask them if they need help or tell your teacher about it

...If you come to school every day this will help you when you go to secondary school and have to take big exams

...Tell your mum/dad that you have to come to school every day, the law says so

...Try to come to school every day even if you get up late
