Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your continued support this term. Life in Vernon Park is almost back to normal: learning experiences are challenging your children daily and there is a real buzz about the school as the children embrace their learning each day.

Please do not send juice into school, other than as part of a packed lunch, as this will negatively affect your child's teeth. Children wearing PE Kits and Forest School clothes to school has been extremely successful. Please label all clothing items clearly with their full name and encourage your child to follow the uniform policy on PE Days.

We continue to have an amount of lost property in school. Please do put your child's name on everything that comes into school.

The School Council asked that we organise an Easter Trail as they had thoroughly enjoyed the Christmas Trail. Therefore, all classes will be taking part in our Forest School Easter Trail next Monday 28th or Tuesday 29th.
