


Attendance at Vernon Park Primary School



WHY IS ATTENDANCE SO IMPORTANT?

We all want our children to do well. Good attendance at school will lead to better opportunities for your children in their adult life.

Every minute matters,
every second counts!



HOW IS GOOD ATTENDANCE REWARDED?

- Children achieve better in school!
- Children with 100% attendance are awarded with a sticker each half term in a special assembly and enjoy a celebration playtime.
- Children with 100% attendance for the whole school year are given a certificate and a book token at our end of year awards assembly. (Suspended due to Covid)

WHAT DOES POOR ATTENDANCE MEAN FOR YOUR CHILD?

It is important to realise as a Parent/Carer the impact that absence from school has on the overall development and achievement of your child. It is worth noting the impact of poor attendance over a five year period. If your child's attendance overall is:

100% = full attendance

95% = $\frac{1}{4}$ of a school year missed

90% = $\frac{1}{2}$ of a school year missed

35% = $\frac{3}{4}$ of a school year missed

30% = the equivalent of 1 whole school year missed

A CHILD WHO TAKES OFF 10 DAYS IN ANY ACADEMIC YEAR WILL ONLY ACHIEVE 94.7% ATTENDANCE.

WHAT IF MY CHILD IS ILL?

We understand that there are times when your child is ill. Don't keep your child off if they only have a slight cold or they are feeling tired. Bring your child to school, the majority of the time once your child is in school with their friends and learning they will be ok. If your child is not fit to be in school we will call you to collect them.

Please support the school by informing us of any absence on the **first day** that your child is not in school. After the first day of illness, if we do not hear from you again, we will contact you for an update.

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CAN MY CHILD TAKE A HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME?

Although we understand how important it is for families to spend time together and the benefits of a family holiday to children, we strongly request that you plan your holidays outside school term time. In September 2013 new regulations were introduced by the Department for Education which state that "headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances". You can find out more about these new regulations on the DfE website.

If there are exceptional circumstances when a parent/carer may need to request absence for their child we ask that they fill in the request form that is available from the school office.

There are 13 weeks holiday from school each year, including a 5 week long summer holiday. It should therefore not be necessary to take additional absence from school during term time. If a child has an unauthorised absence in term time an Education Penalty Notice of £60 - £120 will be issued by Stockport Family Education Welfare.

APPOINTMENTS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY.


Please refrain from making appointments during the school day. If possible, please provide us with written evidence of the appointment from the practitioner.



WHAT IF MY CHILD IS LATE?


Children can come to school from 8.45am and school starts at 8.55am. If your child arrives after this time they will miss valuable teaching and learning time. If your child is late they must report to the school office and enter their name in the late book.

You will be aware that it is a parental responsibility to ensure regular school attendance.

Stockport Family Education Welfare can issue fixed penalty notices of £60 (rising to £120) per parent per child to parents whose children do not attend school regularly or who take holidays during term time.
