Autumn Two Values: Friendship and Respect

Dear Parents and Carers

What a busy start we have had this half term!

The Halloween Disco was a huge success: the children had a lovely time. Thank you to Mr Spence, the DJ, who gave his services to school free of charge; the PTA; and to parents and staff who helped. Your feedback with regards to the disco timings would be greatly appreciated, as we are very much hoping to hold a Valentine's Disco and Summer Beach Party Disco later this academic year.

We continue to be able to offer drop-ins with our Team Around the School professionals; School Age Plus Worker; and School Nurse. Please check the calendar on the school website for dates and times. Mrs Bommer and I are available most Tuesdays from 8:30am to 9:30am, if you wish to pop in to discuss any worries, concerns or challenges.

After the disruption to the children's education in the height of the pandemic, attendance in school is a huge priority for us all. You all received your child's attendance for the first half term. We will be sending these letters out to you every half term. The Local Authority are proactively encouraging us to support you to improve all children's attendance.

Unfortunately, I have had further complaints from local residents about the noise level before school in Peak Street park as well as outside school at drop off and pick-up time. Please could you turn off car engines if you are waiting and remind the children of our expectations of their behaviour regarding our neighbours.

Parking outside school, as well as cars reversing along Peak Street, continues to be a challenge. I have received further complaints about cars parking on the yellow lines on the corner of Bateson Street and Peak Street, Newbridge Lane and Alpine Road as well as the disabled spaces on Peak Street without displaying a blue badge. Your help with this matter would be greatly appreciated. Please contact the school office if you would like a permit, which would entitle you (or whoever collects your child) to free parking before and after school in Newbridge Lane Car Park.

Please may I ask that you refrain from talking directly to children other than your own without the permission of their parents and carers as it can cause distress to the children. School are always available to help in sorting out any issues that may arise and you can contact us for support via our social media platforms, via email, telephone or in person.

Dates for your diary relating to our planned Christmas activities can be found at the end of this newsletter. All dates are also on the calendar on the school website.

We encourage the children to respect (one of our twelve values) each other and all staff members at Vernon Park Primary. Our support team of Teaching Assistants, Higher Level Teaching Assistants, Pastoral Staff, Kitchen Staff, Site Staff and Office Staff contribute hugely to the good education the children receive and deserve the respect of the children. Unfortunately, a number of reading books, library books and reading record books have been lost this half term. The school budget (like all personal budgets) is suffering due to increased costs, so we will have to ask families for a contribution if items are lost to ensure they can be replaced.

We continue to have large amounts of lost property. Please name all items of clothing and belongings that come into school, so we can return the items to the children, thus saving you money and keeping our school environment clean and safe.

Please ensure that your child has a water bottle in school with them every day, so that they can remain hydrated. We have water coolers in school and the children can refill bottles throughout the day with cool, filtered water. Children are not allowed any fizzy drinks in school at any time; including fizzy water. Diluted juice or flavoured water may be sent into school for your children to drink with their lunch. However, as diluted juice or flavoured water has a detrimental effect on children's teeth, we do not allow them to sip these drinks throughout the day. Therefore, drinking bottles may only be filled with water, unless there is a documented medical reason.

The entire staff body at Vernon Park remain committed to ensuring our pupils, families and staff are kept as safe and healthy as possible. Our safeguarding responsibilities encompass all of our children and our staff work diligently to fulfil this role. Unfortunately, in the ever-modernising world we live in, digital and online safety remains a pressing concern. We urge all parents to be vigilant around social media, online gaming, viewing and communication and safety guidelines such as age restrictions. Children are increasingly vulnerable to inappropriate content and we cannot tackle this successfully without your support.

There has been much written in the press about the possible negative impact on families' finances from children bringing sweets, cakes etc into school to celebrate their birthdays. As a staff we have discussed this, but would value your opinions before any decision is made. A reminder that lollipops and bubble or chewing gum are not allowed due to the choking and injury hazards they present. We remain a nut free school.
